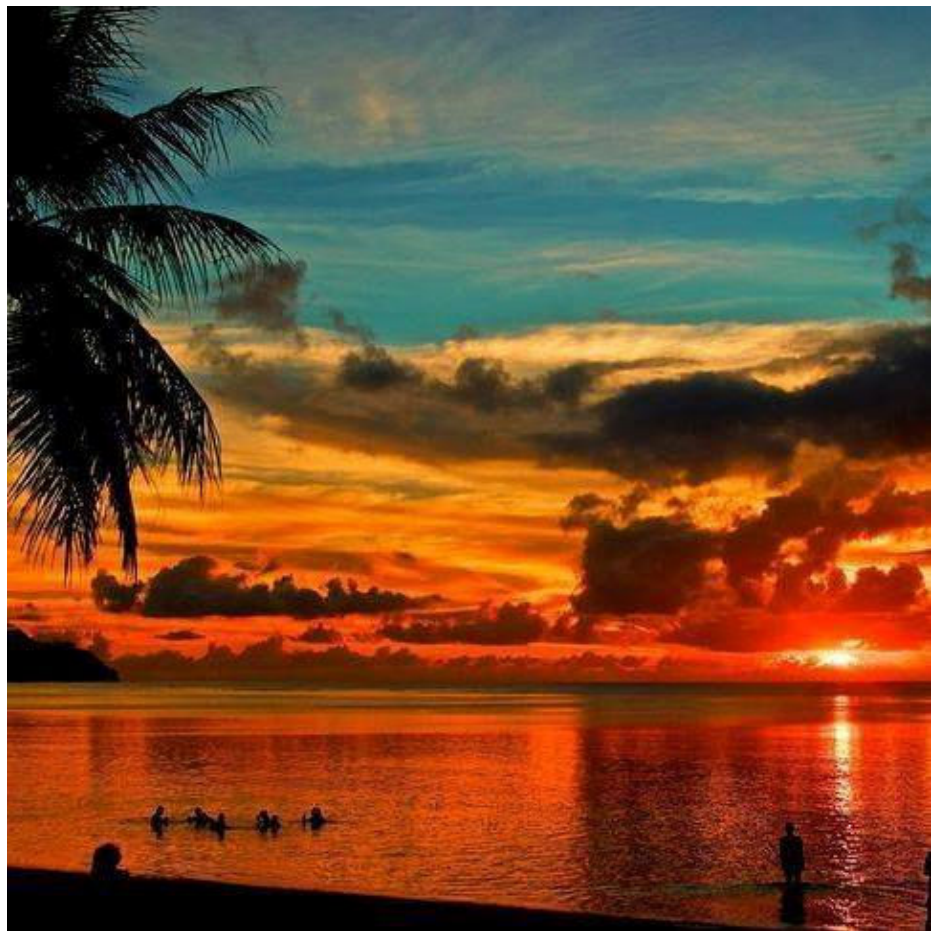

Associational Missionary Highlights **Jason Jones**

In recent weeks, I have found myself, on a number of occasions explaining to those who ask about my job. One of the most identifying things in our society about how to begin interacting with or thinking about a person is what they do (that's not necessarily good, but its reality). I had a certain seminary president that was sitting next to a farmer on a plane once. After talking about what kind of farming he did, the question from the farmer was, "and what do you do?" The president told him that he was a rancher. "Oh yeah," the farmer said with excitement awaiting further explanation of the kind of ranching, and what was his role in ranching, etc. Dr. Patterson told the farmer that he was in the sheep and goat ranching business with his father. He told the farmer that he and his father together took goats and changed them into sheep. He then proceeded to share the gospel with the farmer.

Now every illustration isn't to be taken to its furthest end (and this one has some theological problems), but the point for us is well made, we are to be seeking sheep, growing sheep, multiplying sheep, and sending out sheep. As I explain my work to others, I tell them that there is a group of churches that voluntarily link arms to reach our area. As a group of churches, we want to see ALL of our county and the surrounding communities in which our churches gather, become the flock of our Heavenly Father. We want ALL of the 40,000-50,000 people to be sheep? Do you think ALL is possible? Do you think ALL is our goal?

How are we doing? Glad you asked. In Tift County there are about 40K people. In the surrounding communities that our churches reach (Enigma, Alapaha, Lenox, and Sparks), there might be 10K, but probably not. Anyway, the Mell has 12,048 people on the rolls of our churches. We have an average worship attendance of 4,196 per Sunday. If we operate on a round number of 45,000 people, that comes to about 9.3% of our area attending our churches. If we assume that those who attend are sheep (BIG assumption), we are reaching 9% of our area. Not too good.

But we want to reach the ALL. So we must begin to focus our efforts on the segments of the population that we are missing. Some are obvious. Some we must search out. The GBC can help with that by providing demographic and sociographic information specific to your church and immediate surrounds. There is enough work and goats to fill all of our church buildings. Revival among us is a must. Reaching the ALL, will take place when the 4,196 take their commission seriously and make a disciple. Just think if each of the average attendees made a disciple-maker every other year, we would reach the ALL in 7 years.

We must bloom where we are planted, serve in the church families that God has placed us in, in the communities that God has placed us in. We must also make inroads to areas and peoples that we are not reaching, advancing the kingdom of heaven, pushing back the gates of hell. We sing Rescue the Perishing, but are we doing that? Are we willing to think outside the norm to do it?

Who are the "nones"?

Several polls have been taken over the last few years that have given rise to a new identifiable group of people. They are simply identified by the name "nones". Who are these "nones", and what role are they playing in American society?

Gallup began tracking how Americans identified themselves with religion in 2008. They released the results in January, 2013. The percentage of American adults who said they have no explicit religious identification averaged 17.8%, up from 14.6 % in 2008.

To measure religious identity, Gallup asks respondents this question: *What is your religious preference -- are you Protestant, Roman Catholic, Mormon, Jewish, Muslim, another religion, or no religion?* "Nones" are those who respond "no religion" as well as those who say they don't know or refuse to answer.

Greg Smith, a senior researcher at the Pew Research Center, did a study where he reports one-fifth (approximately 64 million) of Americans identify themselves as "nones". He further stated in the report that "nones" are more likely to be under the age of 30. Smith commented during a National Public Radio (NPR) interview that one defining characteristic of the "nones" is their social liberalism. He went on to say that three-quarters of this group favor same-sex marriage and abortion. Robert Putnam, a Harvard professor who writes extensively about religion in public life, sees a creeping secularization as the leading cause in the rise of "nones".

Lifeway researcher, Ed Stetzer, in an article for CNN, recently pointed out at least a small ray of hope. From 1972 through 2014, regular church attendance by evangelicals has increased nationally from 7.9% (16.59 million/210 million) of the population to 12.5% (39.87 million/319 million).

So, what does all of this mean? When looking at all of the data, it seems America's younger generations are moving away from organized religion and forming a more secular society. The question now becomes, how can we reverse this trend? Churches must get back to the basics of discipling their members, who, in-turn, must share the Good News with everyone they meet.
